Understanding that as you grow up you need money to achieve your dreams. Children will begin to think about different jobs and the different wages associated with the jobs. They will identify jobs that they might like to have and then think about to achieve their dream job.

<u>History</u>

What is the legacy of Tudor London?

Understand where the Tudors came in British history and explore the family tree. Research the Tudor legacy of buildings in London including the significance of Hampton Court and explore what palace life was like. Explore what Tudors ate based on foods available at that time. Develop an understanding of what problems Elizabeth I faced when she became Queen and explain why the Spanish Armada was important in terms of Tudor Legacy.

<u>Art</u>

Tudor drawing Explore the work of Stephen Wiltshire. Create drawings inspired by Stephen Wiltshire. Explore and re-create Tudor portraits

<u>Science</u>

What are the different forces and what does each force do?

Explore basic forces and be able to explain movement in diagrams including what gravity is and how it is measured, the effects of friction, air resistance and water resistance. Investigate how mechanisms such as levers, pulleys and gears work.
